SCHOOL LIBRARY MEDIA COORDINATOR (076) SAMPLE JOB DESCRIPTION

In North Carolina, the school's library media coordinator may be identified by a variety of titles such as librarian, teacher librarian, or media specialist. The official title for certification purposes is school library media coordinator, and this position requires a teaching license.

**CERTIFICATION:** Approved program requirements that must be met to qualify for K-12 School Library Media Coordinator certification are at the master's degree level and were adopted by the State Board of Education in 1987. Along with a teaching license, requirements include:

- One of the following:
  - Completion of an approved program for a media coordinator at the master's degree level or above
  - Completion of an approved program after July 1, 1984, allows a provisional license upon employment with requirement to update to master's degree level
  - Obtain a provisional media coordinator license
